Sex Offender Registration and Notification Act Federal Jurisdiction: Tribal and Territory Properties Registration Requirements

NOTICE AND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

Pursuant to Michigan Public Act 295 of 1994 as amended in 1996, 1999, and 2002, and in accordance with the Jacob Wetterling Crimes Against Children and Sexually Violent Offender Registration Act (42 United States Code 14071), Pam Lychner Sexual Offender Tracking and Identification Act of 1996 (42 United States Code 14072), and the Campus Sex Crimes Prevention Act (42 United States Code 14071), **you are herby notified of your responsibilities to register as a convicted sex offender.**

SORNA TITLE 1 of the Adam Walsh Child Protection and Safety Act of 2006 (P.L. 109-248) refers to "jurisdiction" as the 50 states, the District of Columbia, the principle U.S. territories, the Common Wealth of Puerto Rico, Guam, American Samoa, the Common Wealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, the United States Virgin Islands, and any Indian tribe that elects to function as a registration jurisdictions under SORNA § 127. And, pursuant to the Memorandum of Agreement between the Michigan Department of State Police and Grand Traverse Band of Ottawa and Chippewa Indians, dated June 25, 2009, where both parties are "jurisdictions" as that term is defined in the Sex Offender Registration and Notification Act (SORNA).

You are hereby notified of your responsibility to check in or register with tribal police or with the appropriate tribal authority when entering any tribal lands as each tribal jurisdiction has their own registration requirements separate from and in addition to the state of Michigan as provided for under the SORNA federally mandated National Guidelines.

Pursuant to 9 GTBC 4.04 C; A sex offender required to register with the GTB tribal police under the GTB SORNA code shall do so in person and in the following timeframe: no later than 24 hours after entry onto tribal lands. Any sex offender who is visiting, establishing a residence, commencing employment, becoming a student on tribal lands or is homeless or is a transient within tribal lands shall register with the Tribal police department within 24 hours.
