FOUR NEW CASES IDENTIFIED

December 7th, 2020

- The GTB Health Department is announcing four (4) new positive cases on December 7th. Two (2) cases were symptomatic and two (2) cases were asymptomatic. The local health departments for Leelanau and Grand Traverse County were notified as the county of residence. The local health departments are in the process of completing a case investigation. If you've been identified as a close contact (**someone who was within 6 feet of an infected person for a cumulative of 15 minutes or more over a 24 hour period starting from 2 days before illness onset or 2 days prior to test specimen collection until the patient is isolated**) during the course of the case investigation, please expect to receive a call or text from the local health department or the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services. **It is critically important you respond to the call or text in order to protect the community from further spread.**
- Below is summary information for 69 cases to date:
 - 12 Active cases, 56 recovered cases, 1 death
 - 52 symptomatic, 17 asymptomatic at time of test
 - 41 had known exposure within 2 weeks prior to test
 - 7 had traveled within 2 weeks prior

By Age

- 0-19 – 8 cases
- 20-29 yrs – 14 cases
- 30-39 yrs – 11 cases
- 40-49 yrs – 9 case
- 50-59 yrs – 9 cases
- 60-69 yrs – 10 cases
- 70-79 yrs – 4 cases
- 80-89 yrs – 3 cases
- >89 yrs – 1 case

By County of Residence
