Summer is in full swing and I hope you're safely enjoying the outdoors and great weather.

Interlochen Arts Academy/
GTB Leadership Meeting. GTB
leadership met with leadership from
the Interlochen Arts Academy (IAA)
at their campus on June 29th to see
how IAA can support GTB students,
either at their day camps or for
longer term on-campus studies. I will
keep you posted on the progress of
this exciting collaboration.

<u>The Termination Era</u>. Two federal acts that deeply and profoundly affected Indian Country were passed

by Congress 70 years ago on August 15, 1953. One was the Termination Act, and the other was Public Law 280. The Termination Act was a House concurrent resolution that terminated over 100 tribes by removing their federal recognition and tribal funding. It was on the same date that Congress passed Public Law 280, transferring federal criminal and civil jurisdiction over tribes to certain states – commonly referred to as "PL 280 states" in Indian Country. The Termination Era, which ran from 1953 through 1968, had begun, and many would argue that during this era the federal government was reducing its trust responsibilities to tribes. This era ended in 1968 with the passage of the Indian Civil Rights Act and President Lyndon B. Johnson's new Indian policy of Self-Determination. It was in 1968 when Congress created the Indian Business Fund, and Congress also prohibited states from taking any jurisdiction over Indian reservations without the consent of the affected tribe. What's horrible to contemplate is that over 2.5 million acres of trust land was removed from its protected status, many tribes lost their federal recognition, and thousands of Native Americans were displaced from their homelands. The termination policy was officially ended in 1970 during the Nixon administration.

Labor Day 2023. Labor Day is a federal holiday that the tribe also recognizes; this year it occurs on Monday, September 4, 2023. To many the Labor Day weekend signals the end of summer since the school year typically starts after Labor Day. Labor Day was created in the late 1800s to celebrate labor, and nowadays it's considered a day of rest (after a barbeque at the park!).





All this time, right around the corner in the pine and hardwood forests of Interlochen, Michigan, is the Interlochen Arts Academy. It is an internationally acclaimed boarding high school where students pursue their artistic skills and complete their academic curriculum. It is where you are likely to overhear students saying: Did you hear the riff that he played last night? I finally got that last grand pile right yesterday; You would not believe the shots we got last night for our film; Are we meeting tonight to make our new reeds?' Are you going to the jazz concert tonight?

Regular High Schools can sometimes be a place where students are going through the motions, dutifully completing their standardized college preparation and vocational-technical courses: Day in and day out. In addition, the Interlochen campus has weekly student performances and concerts as well as national and international artists performing—especially at the Interlochen summer concert series!

Hot Cars Kill Kids: A Preventable Tragedy

Since 1998, more than 940 children have tragically lost their lives to pediatric vehicular heatstroke - a heartbreaking statistic that could have been entirely prevented.



Heatstroke is the leading cause of non-traffic, noncrash-related fatalities for children aged 14 and younger.

Even though the death rate has been lower in recent years, with approximately 38 children still losing their lives annually due to vehicular heatstroke, we must remain vigilant. The three main scenarios in which heatstroke occurs are when children are forgotten in vehicles by parents or caregivers, when they gain access to unlocked vehicles and become trapped inside, or when they are knowingly left in vehicles.

Most vehicular heatstroke deaths happen because a child is unintentionally forgotten in a hot car. This accounts for more than half of all child heatstroke deaths since 1998.

Parents or caregivers, often overwhelmed by their busy lives, may forget that a child is in the back of the vehicle, especially if they are quiet or sleeping, typically affecting children under one year of age. Always remember to look before you lock, and you could save a life.

Toddlers and young children are also at risk as they can access vehicles without supervision may become trapped inside, particularly if child locks are activated.

It's crucial to teach children not to play in or around cars and to store keys out of their reach.

In some cases, children are intentionally left in hot vehicles by parents who don't fully grasp the dangers or how rapidly temperatures can become life-threatening. The message is clear: Never leave your child alone in a vehicle, not even for a minute.

Heatstroke can have devastating consequences, and children are at higher risk than adults because their body temperature rises much faster. At a core body

temperature of approximately degrees, heatstroke 107 becomes lethal. Even on relatively mild days, vehicles can heat up significantly within minutes, and rolling down windows does little to alleviate the danger.

Notably, the peak season for heatstroke incidents is during the summertime, but it can occur at outdoor temperatures as low as 57 degrees. Be aware of the warning signs, which may

include red and hot skin, absent sweating, a rapid pulse, headache, dizziness, nausea, confusion, or unusual behavior.

To prevent these tragedies, remember these three crucial steps:

- 1. **NEVER** leave a child unattended in a vehicle.
- **2**. **ALWAYS** check the back seat every time you exit the
- 3. LOCK the car and keep the keys out of reach.

By spreading awareness about the dangers of vehicular heatstroke, we can work together to ensure the safety of our children and prevent heartbreaking any more losses.

Stay informed and help us protect our little ones from entirely this preventable tragedy.

THE PURSUIT OF PUBLIC HEALTH



Aanii, my name is Gnaajiwi Anderson, and I am a tribal member of the Grand Traverse Band and an upcoming sophomore pursuing a degree in Public Health at The University of Michigan.

FROM THE RESERVATION TO UNIVERSITY OF MICHIGAN

In June of 2022, when I graduated high school, I felt accomplished but also had this pit in my stomach about having to move 259 miles from the only place I had ever known. I felt ready, but I also didn't feel ready. Confusing? I know, it was for me too. What I've learned is that I don't think anyone ever really feels ready. For me, it was that feeling that pushed me.

"...pursuing a degree in Public Health...," was the difficult part of my introduction. I had known I wanted to pursue a career in healthcare since elementary school. I am normally an indecisive person anyways and being able to choose from thousands

of careers in health care I was stumped. I love learning new things and with anatomy, I was able to learn new things about it every day. The fact that we don't even 100% know the why for some things is so bizarre and extraordinary to me. Since I was going from high school to college my identity and who I was had been put through the test when I first arrived on campus.

INVISIBLE NO MORE

I had to attend a summer program before my official freshman year, and I was really excited about this program because everyone there was supposed to be like me. It was minority-based and people from all over Michigan or neighboring states came from small schools just like I did. There were so many different people, cultures, and ways of life that I was never exposed to being from northern Michigan. I was so excited to learn since I have only grown up around my Native people. In class when we would talk about our ethnicities it was obvious that when it came to my turn everyone was listening because they had no idea what I was. There was one time when we were doing a workshop and this person just couldn't wait any longer and finally said, "I know you're not white, what are you?" I was taken back a bit and then finally told them and every other person who asked me before what I am and every single time, I was told I was the first Native American they had ever met. This fact is sad, but it also enlightened me about what was most important. If we are this invisible

and 'rare' then it is up to us as Native people to save ourselves. It was then I decided to pursue public health to focus on my people.

ACT FAST AND EFFICIENTLY

You learn a lot when you're exposed to a different environment than where you grew up. I learned who I was and what it is I was meant to do. Since I will be going back to school this will be my last article. To sum up what I have learned while being at the GTB health clinic is that 1) there is LOTS of paperwork and 2) healthcare workers are amazing (not to be biased). Healthcare is a field that must act fast and efficiently to do what's best for its patients, which in this case is us. Being able to help people is all I have always wanted to do and after being able to see this field in action and how many people are needed to finish the puzzle, I am confident in the field I have chosen for my career path and that healthcare is where I want to be.







Household Hazardous Waste

What is "HHW"?

Household Hazardous Waste are chemicals which are potentially hazardous to the environment due to their toxic, corrosive, flammable or reactive properties

Some examples include cleaning products, pesticides, pharmaceuticals, batteries, aerosol sprays, electronics, oil-based paint & more,

How are they dangerous?

If flushed down the toilet or poured down the drain, HHW materials can travel through the water cycle and contaminate our lakes, rivers

If thrown out in the trash, some materials may react with other substances inside a garbage truck or the landfill, causing fires, explo-

If left around the house, they can catch fire, react or explode under certain circumstances. They can also cause harm to children and pets if not disposed of properly.



What do I do with it?

- Never pour a hazardous chemical into a storm drain. down your sink/toilet or onto the ground.
- Never put hazardous waste with regular trash pick-up.
- Keep items in their original, labeled containers and do not mix multiple substances in one container.
- Store safely away from animals and children until they can be taken to a hazardous waste site.
 - Make sure items are secured while trans

Tips to Reduce HHW

- Check the labels and look for words such as "warning", cautious" flammable", "toxic", etc.
- Only buy what you need. Share with others if you have
- leftover product to ensure it gets used up entirely. Find safe substitutes. Many household cleaners can be
- made from baking soda, lemon juice and other organic and/or non-toxic ingredients.
