## **ANNOUNCING THREE (3) NEW COVID-19 CASES, NOW SCHEDULING FOR COVID-19 VACCINATION OF CHILDREN AGES 5 TO <12, UPDATED INFORMATION ON BOOSTER SHOTS.**

October 25, 2021

- **The GTB Health Department is reporting three (3) new positive COVID-19 cases from October 21<sup>st</sup>.** The local health department for Grand Traverse county was notified as the county of residence and is in the process of completing case investigations. If you've been identified as a close contact (**someone who has been within 6 feet of an infected person (laboratory confirmed or a clinically compatible illness) for a cumulative of 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period. An infected person can spread the virus that causes COVID-19 starting from 2 days before they have any symptoms or, for asymptomatic patients, 2 days before the positive specimen collection date**) during the course of the case investigation, please expect to receive a call or text from the local health department or the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services. **It is critically important you respond to the call or text in order to protect the community from further spread.**
- **IMPORTANT: The GTB Health Department is currently scheduling COVID-19 vaccinations for children ages 5 to <12 starting with the first clinic on November 5<sup>th</sup> at Strongheart.** The GTB Health Department is anticipating receiving the Pfizer pediatric formulation in the week of November 1<sup>st</sup>. Thus, appointments are being scheduled for a pediatric vaccination clinic to be held at Strongheart on November 5<sup>th</sup>. After school hours will be offered in order to vaccinate as many eligible children as possible. Please note, although CDC approval is anticipated in the week of November 1<sup>st</sup>, the GTB Health Department must wait till CDC's final approval before any vaccinations can be administered.

**Please contact the GTB COVID-19 Vaccination Line (231-534-7475) if you would like to schedule a pediatric vaccination or for any questions you may have. Additionally, the GTB Health Department has started reaching out to families of registered patients eligible for the pediatric COVID-19 vaccine.**

- **IMPORTANT: The GTB Health Department is now administering booster shots.**

For individuals who received a Pfizer BioNTech or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine, the following groups are eligible for a booster shot at six (6) months or more after their initial series:

- 65 and older;
- Age 18+ who live in long-term care settings;
- Age 18+ who have underlying medical conditions;
- Age 18+ who work or live in high-risk settings.



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For individuals who received the Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 vaccine, booster shots are also recommended for those who are 18 and older and who were vaccinated two (2) or more months ago.

There are now booster recommendations for all three available COVID-19 vaccines in the United States. Eligible individuals may choose which vaccine they receive as a booster dose. Some people may have a preference for the vaccine type that they originally received, and others may prefer to get a different booster. CDC recommendations now allow for this type of mix and match dosing for booster shots.

The GTB Health Department has administered 3,953 doses, including 2,089 first doses, 1,864 second doses, 2,241 Moderna doses, 1,684 Pfizer doses, and 28 Johnson & Johnson doses. Currently, 59% of GTB tribal members age 12 and over and 82% of GTB elders age 55 and over in the 6-county service area are vaccinated.

- **Below is summary information for the 239 cumulative positive cases to-date tested at the GTB Health Department:**
  - 77 cases since August 1, 2021.
  - 1 case in the week of August 2, 2021.
  - 9 cases in the week of August 9, 2021.
  - 11 cases in the week of August 16, 2021.
  - 13 cases in the week of August 23, 2021.
  - 9 cases in the week of August 30, 2021.
  - 3 cases in the week of September 6, 2021.
  - 7 cases in the week of September 13, 2021.
  - 7 cases in the week of September 20, 2021.
  - 2 cases in the week of September 27, 2021.
  - 6 cases in the week of October 4, 2021.
  - 4 cases in the week of October 11, 2021.
  - 5 cases in the week of October 25, 2021.
  - Average age of cases since August 1, 2021 is 29.3 years old compared to 35.1 prior to August 2021.
