ANNOUNCING FIVE (5) NEW COVID-19 CASES, FLU SHOT CLINIC ON WEDNESDAY NOVEMBER 10th, NOW VACCINATING CHILDREN AGES 5 TO 11, UPDATED INFORMATION ON BOOSTER SHOTS.

November 8, 2021

- **The GTB Health Department is reporting five (5) new positive COVID-19 cases from November 4th.** The local health departments for Grand Traverse and Leelanau county were notified as the county of residence. **We are continuing to see an increase in cases in Leelanau and surrounding counties. Please continue to take measures to reduce spread including vaccination, wearing face masks, avoiding crowded or poorly ventilated settings, staying home when ill, seeking testing if symptomatic or exposed, and frequent handwashing.**
- **The GTB Health Department will hold its drive-through flu-shot clinic on Wednesday, November 10th from 2pm to 4pm at the Medicine Lodge.** This is due to the Veterans Day holiday on Thursday, November 11th. The flu-shot clinic will resume on Thursday, November 18th, 2pm to 4pm, at the Medicine Lodge.
- *****IMPORTANT: The GTB Health Department is currently scheduling COVID-19 vaccinations for children ages 5 to 11 with the next clinic scheduled for November 12th at Strongheart.** The GTB Health Department has received the Pfizer pediatric formulation. Thus, appointments are being scheduled for pediatric vaccinations. After school hours will be offered in order to vaccinate as many eligible children as possible.

Scientists have conducted clinical trials with about 3,000 children and the FDA has determined that the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine has met the safety and efficacy standards for authorization in children ages 5 through 15 years. In addition, Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine has now been FDA-approved for people ages 16 and older. COVID-19 infection can cause serious illness in children, and that risk far exceeds any potential risk of the vaccine. Parents are strongly urged to consider getting a COVID-19 vaccine for children ages 5 years and older as soon as possible. If parents have any concerns or questions about whether the vaccine is right for their child, they should consult with their primary care provider or call the GTB COVID-19 Vaccination Line (231-534-7475) for any questions.

Although children are at a lower risk of becoming severely ill with COVID-19 compared with adults, children can:

- Be infected with the virus that causes COVID-19
 - Get very sick from COVID-19
 - Have both short and long-term health complications from COVID-19
 - Spread COVID-19 to others
- **IMPORTANT: The GTB Health Department is now administering booster shots.**

If you received a Pfizer BioNTech or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine, you are eligible for a booster if you are among the groups noted below and at least 6 months after your second shot:

- 65 years or older;
- Age 18+ who live in long-term care settings;
- Age 18+ who have underlying medical conditions;
- Age 18+ who work or live in high-risk settings.

If you received a Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 vaccine, you are eligible for a booster if you are 18 years or older and at least 2 months after your shot.

You may choose which COVID-19 vaccine you receive as a booster shot. Some people may have a preference for the vaccine type that they originally received, and others may prefer to get a different booster. CDC recommendations now allow for this type of mix and match dosing for booster shots.

Please contact the GTB COVID-19 Vaccination Line (231-534-7475) if you would like to schedule a booster shot, for questions you may have on selecting a booster shot, or other questions. Additionally, the GTB Health Department has started reaching out to registered patients eligible for the booster dose.

The GTB Health Department has now administered 4,083 doses. Currently, 59% of GTB tribal members age 12 and over and 82% of GTB elders age 55 and over in the 6-county service area are vaccinated.

- 2 cases in the week of September 27, 2021.
- 6 cases in the week of October 4, 2021.
- 4 cases in the week of October 11, 2021.
- 5 cases in the week of October 18, 2021.
- 3 cases in the week of October 25, 2021.
- 7 cases in the week of November 1, 2021
